

Note:

- 1.Luminous intensity is measured with a light sensor and filter combination that approximates the CIE eye-response curve.
- 2. 1/2 is the off-axis angle at which the luminous intensity is half the axial luminous intensity.
- 3. The dominant wavelength (d) is derived from the CIE chromaticity diagram and represents the single wavelength which defines the color of the device.

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
